FROM NURSE VICKI:

Even a few serious sunburns can increase your child's risk of getting skin cancer.

1. Use a broad-spectrum sunscreen (UVA & UVB) with an SPF of 30 or higher and generously (1 oz.) 15 minutes before going outdoors.
2. Plan indoor activities during midday. UV rays are the strongest from 10:00-2:00.
3. Wear sunglasses and a hat for added protection.
4. Remember to reapply sunscreen every two hours, or after swimming or sweating.
